June 5 Program Outlines Activities by Local Boy Scouts

Member (and Past President) Chris Minor introduced Jeff Weiss as his speaker at last week's meeting.

Jeff is the Yaquina District Executive for the Boy Scouts of America, Oregon Trail Council.

He noted that there are a number of similarities between the Boy Scout Oath and Rotary's 4-Way Test, and showed them in his PowerPoint presentation.

Jeff also noted that the Boy Scouts are much more than building campfires and tying knots, although he showed a slide of a rope bridge that Scouts built to demonstrate their knot-tying proficiency and it showed how

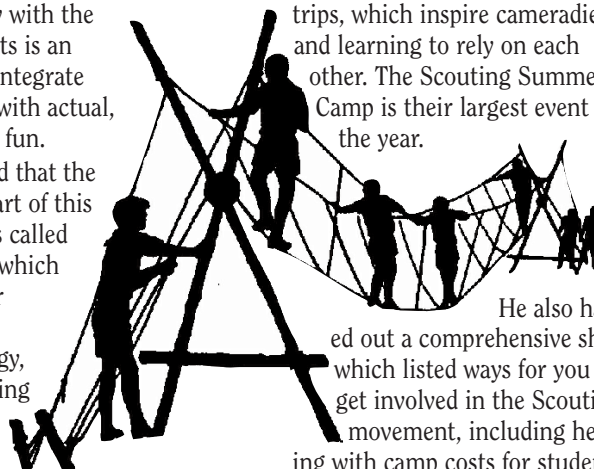
strong and safe such a bridge can be. Your editor isn't quite ready to try it, using his cane, however.

Among the other initiatives underway with the Boy Scouts is an effort to integrate learning with actual, hands-on fun.

Jeff said that the newest part of this process is called "STEM", which stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math.

The goal of this program is to "trick them into learning".

Jeff added that the Scouts do monthly hiking and backpacking trips, which inspire camaraderie and learning to rely on each other. The Scouting Summer Camp is their largest event of the year.



He also handed out a comprehensive sheet which listed ways for you to get involved in the Scouting movement, including helping with camp costs for students.
