## Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital is Program Topic

Past president David Bigelow presented the program at last week's meeting, ably assisted by Ursula Marinelli and Ralph Breitenstein, MD, who is the Vice Chairperson of the Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital Foundation.

Dave began by providing a little history of our hospital and the area of the taxing district, which runs from the middle of Lincoln Beach to Yachats but does not include Toledo, Siletz or Eddyville. The hospital and its district that served the east county closed in the mid-1980s.

Of course, the main topic of the program was the proposed new Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital planned to be built on ground adjacent to, and in some cases part of, the current hospital.

The anticipated cost of the new facility will be \$57 million, to be borne by residents of the hospital district via a property tax levy.

Current estimated length of time for retiring that levy 20 years. The estimated assessment for the levy is 98 cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation.

It was noted that some of the buildings in the current hospital campus are 60 years old and beginning to show their age.

The proposed new facilities are set to include modern health care equipment and sufficient space not only for increased hospital inpatient care but also outpatient care and additional clinic space to accommodate more specialties and

anticipated increased offices for more types of patient care.
