With an overall total budget of approximately \$4.3 million, the improvements and expansion projects going on are a welcome sight to the 28 year old building. With 4 of the 8 expansion and enhancement projects completed, the goals to better serve the acoustic requirements, improve audience experience, allow simultaneous performances to occur and increase facility revenue and sustainability is coming to a reality.

The PAC is an economic and cultural treasure of Newport that enriches the lives of many. The PAC is home to 189 performances a year and 11 resident companies and in use an average of 350 days a year welcoming an average of 25,979 ticket purchasing audience members annually.
