ROTARY CLUB OF NEWPORT'S GRANT PROJECT IN ACTION

Your Rotary Club's community service grant on Human Trafficking Awareness brought Liz Alston of Northwest Family Services to speak to the club on January 28th. Liz was in Newport to present their program called "Deceptions". Deceptions is an interactive school-based awareness curriculum for youth in middle and high schools. The average age of a trafficking victim is 12-14 years old, so middle school and high school students are the target audience. The curriculum provides tools and builds awareness in exposing the lures of child sex trafficking and internet dangers. The true story of a sex trafficking survivor is utilized to teach students about healthy relationships and boundaries as well as how to protect themselves and others from this form of modern day slavery.

all schools in the Lincoln County School District as a result a grant that NW Family Services used to supplement the Rotary funds. Each school chose how they would receive the classroom training. Lincoln City and Newport elected to present the program in their health classes. Toledo and Waldport chose to have the training in assembly format; thus the three sessions were presented in sequence during morning and afternoon schedules. Five classes at Newport High School had session one of the 3 part series. Detective Lance Cummings of Newport Police Department attended the training to learn how to present sessions two and three to the Newport High classes at dates to be arranged between the police department and the health teacher at the school. An estimated 700 students participated in the program.

In addition to the in-school training, Officer Mike Gallagher of the Portland Police Bureau's Human Trafficking Division conducted training for law enforcement officers on Saturday, January 23. Officers from Newport and Toledo Police departments and the Lincoln County Sheriff's office participated. Officer training was also held on Tuesday, January 26th and conducted by Liz Alston. The law enforcement training was geared toward awareness, identification and treatment of potential victims.
